HELDIG Profiling Action 2016-2020

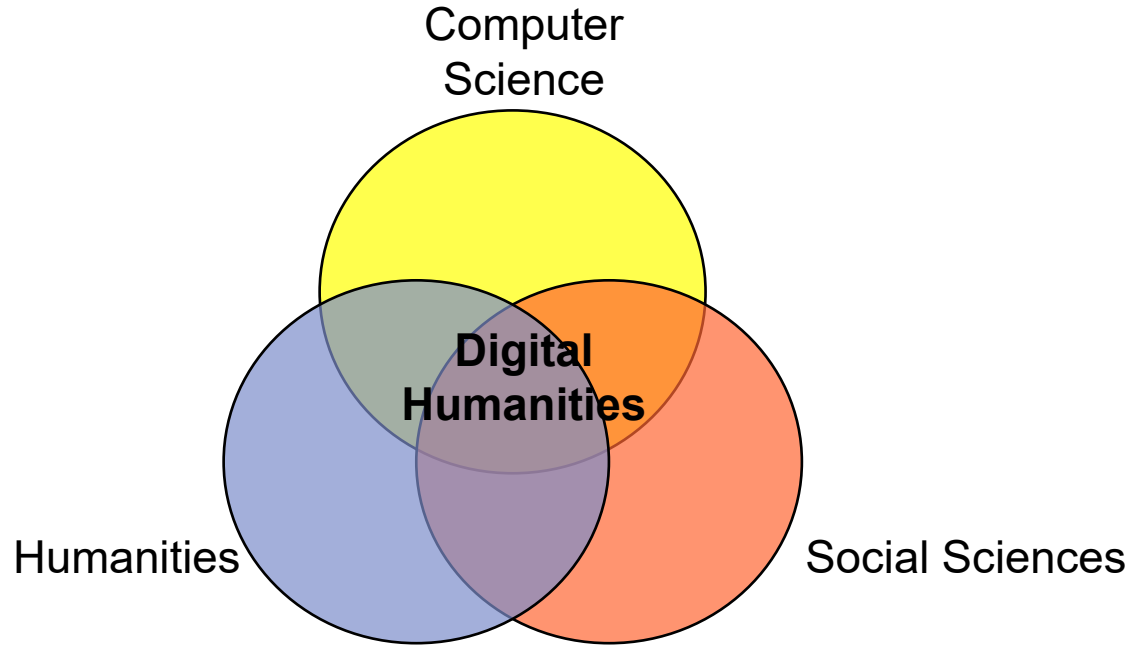
- Part of Academy of Finland Profi 2 Programme
- Main Ideas of Profiling
 - Support universities to renew themselves
 - » Create new openings
 - » “Select away” existing areas
 - Support coordination between universities nationally
- HELDIG funding 2016-2020 (with University of Helsinki) ca 10 MEUR
- Timeframe
 - 2016-2020 Initial start phase
 - 2021- Part of normal university activities
- In HELDIG: Focus on Establishing new Professorships

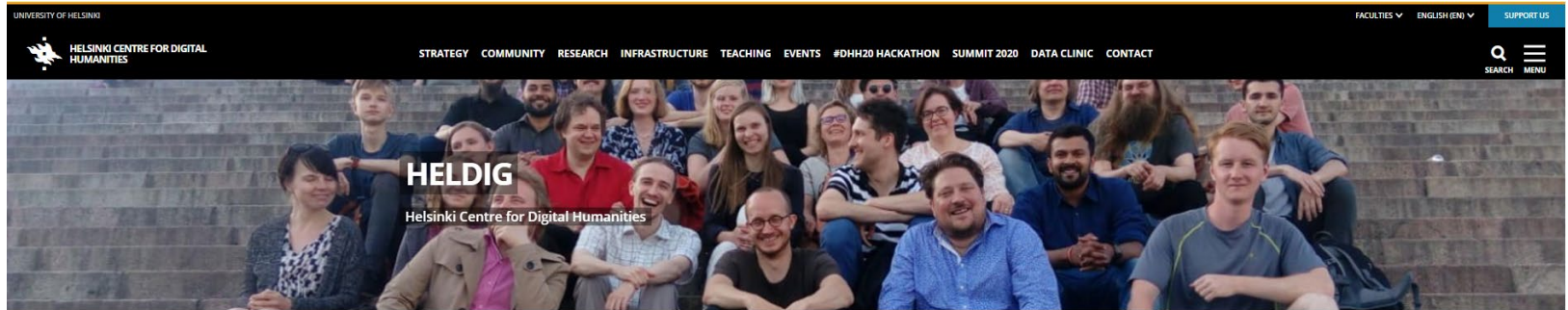
Visions for Tomorrow
