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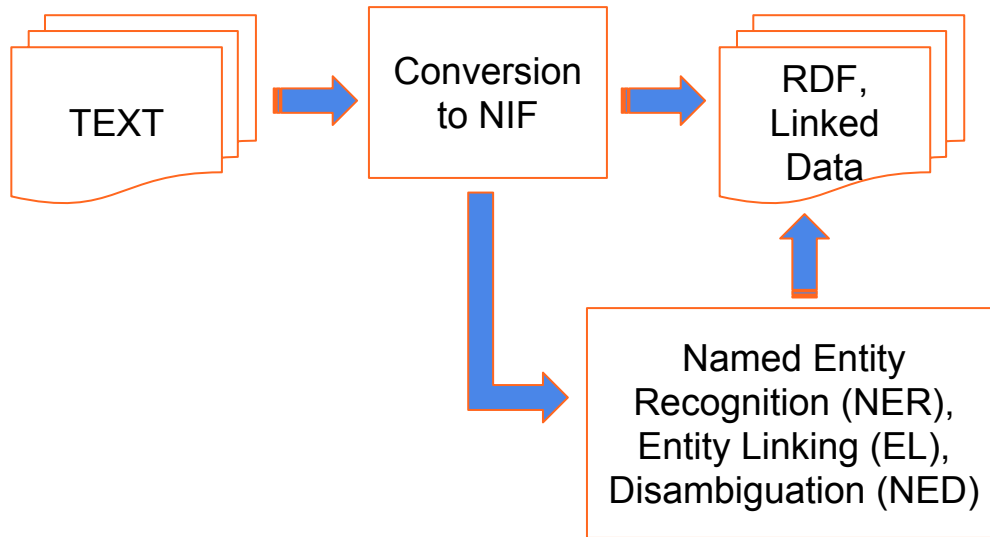
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Transforming Cultural Heritage texts into a knowledge graph

Background

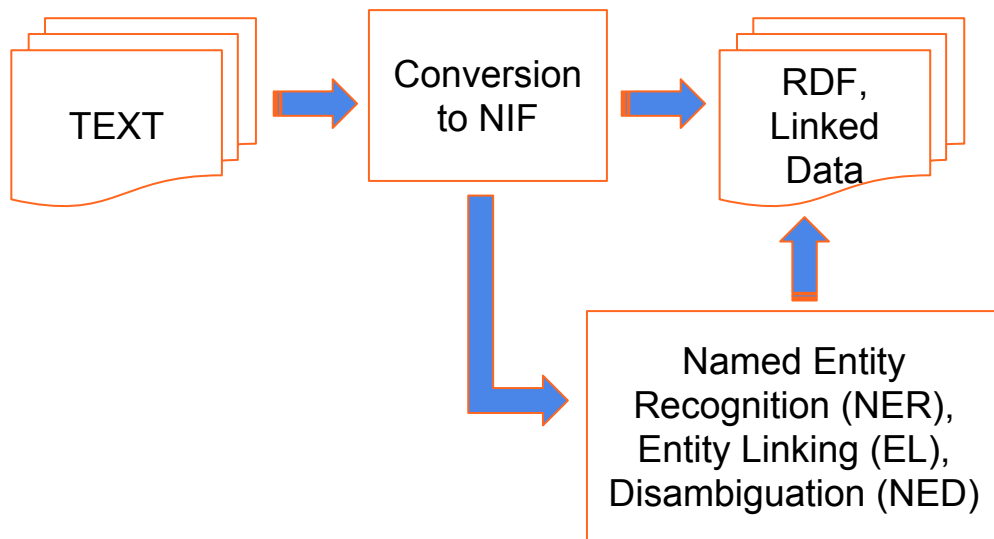
- **Much of the primary data of Digital Humanities is available only in textual form, and there is an ever-growing need for structuring it for semantic analysis.**
- **Transforming Cultural Heritage texts into a knowledge graph and a Linked Data service provide a flexible interface to use the data for different types of analyses.**

Transformation



- **Transforms text to NIF (NLP Interchange Format)**
 - Paragraphs, Titles, Sentences, Words
 - Enriched with morphological and syntactic information

Transformation



- **NIF RDF data used for named entity linking (NEL)**
 - NER, EL, and NED
- **Collecting possible tags for further usage from texts**

Application

- **Published in a SPARQL endpoint service**
- **Knowledge graph can be queried and the data can be used for different purposes**
 - Network Analysis
 - Linguistic Analysis
 - Information Retrieval
 - Contextual reader
- **Examples: biografiasampo.fi**

SeCo NLP Services

- Tools and services for analysing texts as APIs
- Using multiple different tools
 - FiNER, Finnish-dep-parser, LAS, ARPA etc.
 - Services built on top of the tools
 - *Anonymizer, automatic annotation etc.*
- Available in near future

 - Identify all adjectives describing Juha Sipilä in a text?

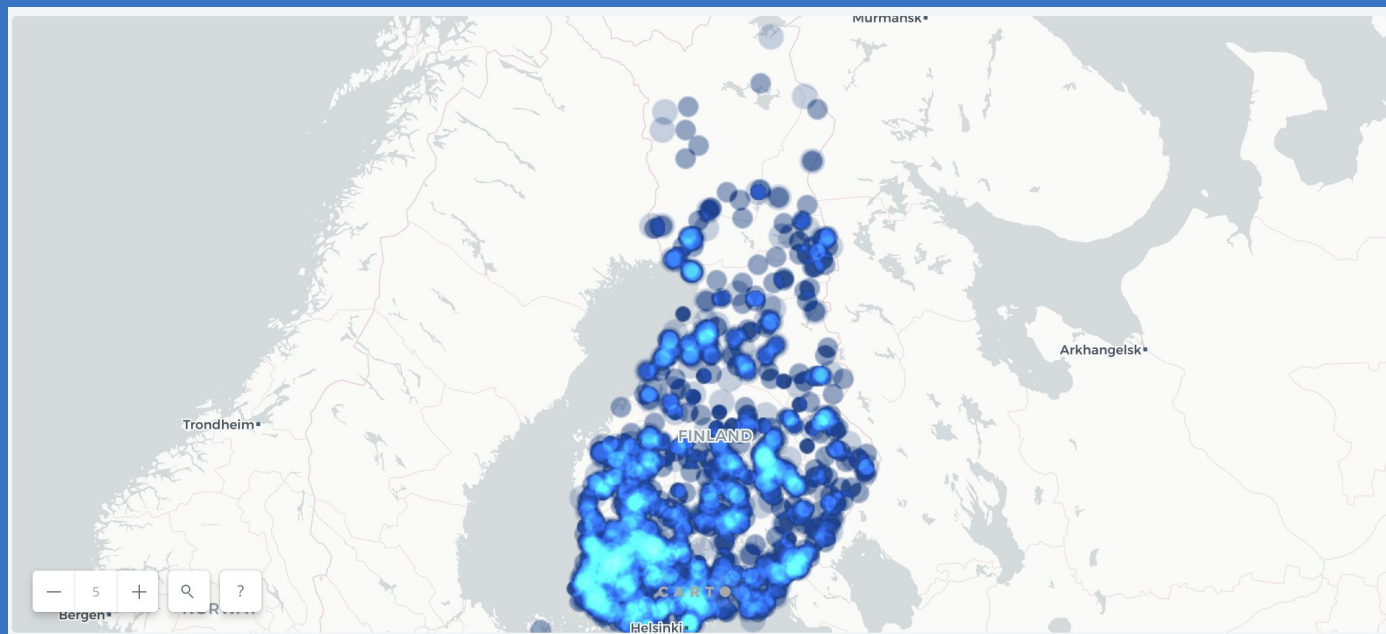


Language Analysis Tool LAS

 - For developers, a web service (<http://demo.seco.tkk.fi/las/> / <https://hub.docker.com/r/jiemakel/las-ws/>)



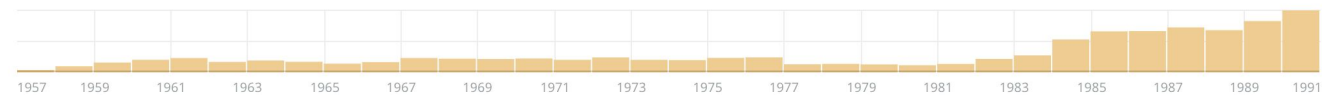

STATEMENT BY **VISCOUNT BRYCE.**

Charles Fryatt



Charles Algernon Fryatt (2 December 1875 – 1915) was a British mariner who was executed by firing a U-boat in 1915. When his ship, the *SS **Cornwallis***, was torpedoed off the Netherlands in 1916, he was captured by the Germans. Although he was a civilian non-combatant, he followed his execution near Bruges, Belgium, and was reburied with full honours in the United Kingdom.

1 §

Lain soveltamisala

Tässä **laissa** säädetään luvasta **oikeudenkäyntiasiamiehenä** ja -avustajana toimimiseen sekä luvan saaneen **oikeudenkäyntiavustajan** velvollisuuksista ja valvonnasta.

Oikeudenkäyntiasiamiehen ja -avustajan kelpoisuusvaatimuksista **oikeudenkäynnissä** säädetään erikseen.

2 §

Luvan myöntämisen edellytykset

Tässä **laissa** tarkoitettu lupa **oikeudenkäyntiasiamiehenä** ja -avustajana toimimiseen **myönnetään** toistaiseksi henkilöille:

1) joka on suorittanut Suomessa **oikeustieteen** muun ylemmän korkeakoulututkinnon kuin kansainvälisen ja **vertailevan oikeustieteen** maisterin tutkinnon taikka ulkomailta vastaavan **oikeustieteen** tutkinnon, joka on tunnustettu Suomessa sen mukaan kuin erikseen säädetään;

2) joka on saavuttanut riittävän perehtyneisyyden **oikeudenkäyntiasiamiehen** ja -avustajan tehtävien osalta;

3) joka on suorittanut **Konkurssi** ja -avustajan kelpoisuusvaatimuksista **oikeudenkäynnissä** säädetään erikseen.

4) joka ei ole **konkurssissa** ja jonka toimintakelpoisuutta ei ole rajoitettu.

Edellä 1 momentin 2 kohdassa tarkoitettu riittävä perehtyneisyys on henkilöllä, joka on:

1) suorittanut **asianajajista** annetun lain (496/1958) 3 §:n 1 momentin 4 kohdassa tarkoitettua asianajajatutkinnon;

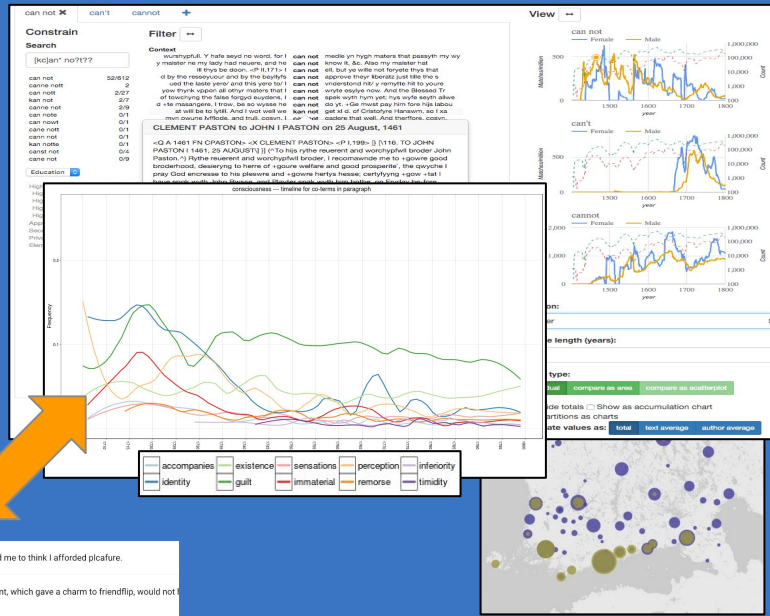
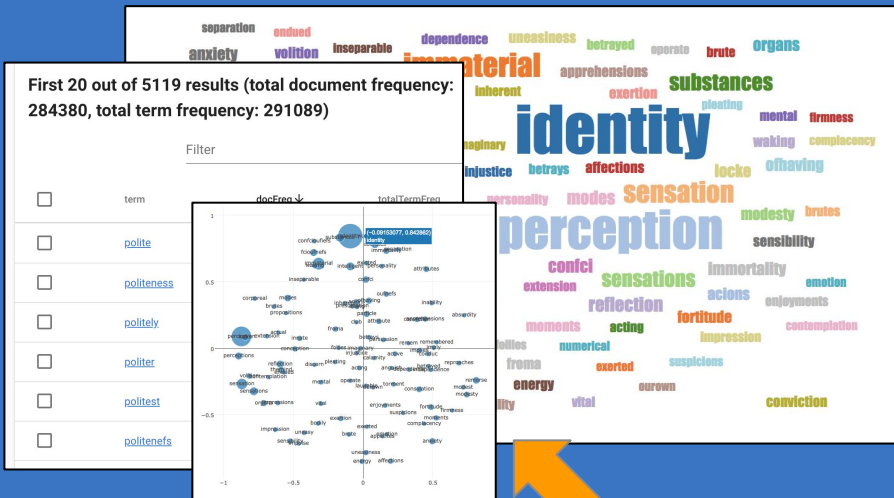


Octavo: complex queries combining structured and unstructured data

- In Dutch newspapers, find all words qualified by “national”
- In Suomi24, find all uses of the word “French” as an adjective in threads that have at least 10 comments and are not in the Travel, History or Automobiles subforums.
- In YLE news data, generate a description of how Ilkka Kanerva is depicted
- In Suomen Kansan Vanhat Runot, find all instances of the formula “small maids” and group them by time and location
- In Eighteenth Century Collections Online, compare the uses of the words “mind” and “soul” across the century, also separately between religious and profane literature

Beyond keyword searches, toward complex subcorpora formulation

- Handling OCR noise
 - politeness, politenefs, politeners, ...
- Linguistic complexity
 - “hopia* vaski*”~10 (any word starting with hopia within 10 words of any word starting with vaski)
 - (/pi[sk]ku.* / OR pien*) AND /pi[ij]at.* /
 - |infl_fi_~2:Väinämöinen (any [dialectal] variation at max two edit distances from any inflected form of the Finnish name Väinämöinen)
